- **veganism** (noun/concept), **vegan** (noun, adjective) the avoidance of all products, food or otherwise, that are derived from animals; someone who adheres to this; describes something compatible with veganism.
- vegetarianism (noun/concept), vegetarian (noun, adjective) a diet that avoids meat or fish but can include
 animal derived products like dairy or eggs; someone who follows this diet; describes something compatible with
 this diet
- flexitarian (noun) someone who only occasionally eats meat or fish.
- meat alternative/substitute (noun), plant-based (adjective) an ingredient not derived from animals used to replace an ingredient traditionally derived from animals; an ingredient/material derived from plants as opposed to animals
- cultured/cultivated/lab-grown meat (nouns) animal meat grown by cultivating animal cells in vitro in a laboratory, rather than by slaughtering animals.
- bacon troll (noun) someone who deliberately mocks vegans, especially in a provocative manner.
