Requirements

Your essay must:

1. Take a clear position

State your claim in the introduction and maintain it throughout the essay.

2. Use evidence from both texts

You must reference:

- The London show shutdown (vandalism, conflict with Crown Estate, artists' intentions)
- The discussion of SAMA and Urban Nation (institutionalization, community involvement, authenticity concerns)

3. Include at least three body paragraphs, using:

- Facts or events from the articles
- Examples of how institutions either help or harm street art
- Analysis showing how the evidence supports your argument

4. Address a counterargument

Briefly acknowledge the other side of the issue and explain why your position still stands.

5. Conclude with a strong final statement

Restate your main idea, explain its importance, and reinforce your argument.
